Dear Brother,---

The noon mail brings me your letter of February 20, with information from Chicago houses regarding nipping presses. The prices are very good for new machinery, but I think we can get something at less expense. The boys are just completing a catalog job for the Sanitarium, and they find they can do fairly good work without a standing press. Nevertheless we would like to have something if it is small and not too expensive. We have a two-rod foolscap letter copying press which I shall lend them. If at any time you come across an old four-rod letter press foolscap size or larger, that can be ~~used~~ bought for from five to ten dollars, please buy it for us, and we will lengthen the rods. I looked in San Francisco for something of this sort, but the great fire burned up a large amount of junk, and I could not find a four-rod press in the city.

Regarding the time of your coming west, if you cannot be here by the first week in March, I sincerely hope that you will delay your trip a week or two longer. I find that the date of our meetings is as follows: Union Conference in Oakland, March 11 to 14; Ministerial Institute, March 15 to 22; annual meeting of St. Helena Sanitarium, March 23 and 24; annual meeting at Loma Linda, March 25 to 29.

I wish you would come through in time to visit Los Angeles and Anaheim, and attend the annual meeting at Loma Linda; then come north with us.
