Dear Brother:--

I received a letter from you a few days ago. I am sorry to know that you have been under the weather. Hope you are better by this time. Wish I could step in and see all our folks, and meet your family all. But we are overwhelmed with work at the present time, and the work is opening wonderfully. I have only a few moments as we start down the river soon to fill an appointment to-night, ten miles down.

I inclose a copy of a letter to mother. I have not had time to read it after the type-writer finished, and so please overlook errors. I wish I had time to go into some particulars with you, but this cannot be this time.

I do not know what we could do in our work without the steamer. It is just what is needed. But we are so pressed with work that we do not know which way to turn.
